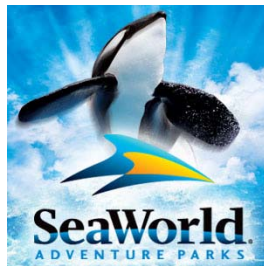

Welcome,

SeaWorld's Adventure Camp interactive and hands-on educating can't be replicated in any classroom. The students will investigate and discover on their own--through visual, auditory and tactile learning. Safety and Security

Sea World's Adventure Camp Center is located on property, within the park. It is a secure facility that is not accessible to non-camp staff or visitors. Camp counselors stay in the dorms with students. The Adventure Camp Center is monitored by SeaWorld's security officers 24 hours a day.

Camp Staff

The camp counselors are experts in managing groups of youth and are selected through a rigorous selection process, including background checks and drug testing. They coordinate all camp activities and supervise your students. In addition, camp staff also includes 24-hour emergency medical personnel and security, plus lifeguards, food service staff, animal keepers, management and support staff.



Accreditation

SeaWorld San Diego Adventure Camps are accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). ACA-accredited camps must meet up to 300 standards for health, safety, and program quality. SeaWorld Adventure Camps exceed ACA standards to ensure a safe and enjoyable camp experience.



Accommodations

The student's Adventure Camp program is all inclusive. Camp fees include lodging, meals and snacks, supplies and equipment, T-shirt, and water bottle. Students will sleep and eat at their new Adventure Camp Center. It includes classrooms, outdoor and indoor play areas, and two floors of separate boys' and girls' dorms. Meals are served by our staff. Chaperones may stay in dorms with students if they wish.

Sample Itinerary

Day 1

Day 2

- 10:00 Forbidden Reef- Feed bat rays and view moray eels. Squid dissection.
- 11:00 Dolphin Discovery public show
- 12:00 Lunch
- 1 pm Interact w/dolphins. Meet with trainer.

- 2:00 Wild Arctic ride. View animals;polar food webs.
- 3:00 Manatee--Environmental concerns
- 4:00 Interact with trainer at Shamu Stadium/Show
- 5:00 Showers and rest time.
- 6:00 Dinner
- 7:00 Skit Night using vocab words learned.
- 9:00 Quiet time/Prep for 10 pm "Lights Out."
